Watering newly seeded areas require different care than established lawns. Follow these recommendations.

- Irrigate the area; you should try to maintain a consistently moist (but not saturated) soil.
- Grass will germinate and grow more vigorously in aeration holes or slits.
- Keep traffic, including children and pets, off of the lawn as much as possible, until the lawn has been mowed a few times and the new grass begins to mature.

Crabgrass Control is the next key factor in improving your lawn. Successful control increases with "Prevention." Preventive action gives your lawns the best fight against the clumpy, coarse-textured, all-around unsightly weed.

Applying a Pre-Emergent Herbicide to your lawn, will stop the crabgrass from emerging by inhibiting seed germination in the soil.

Regular fertilization, a good watering regiment, proper mowing, and pest control is the proper way to prevent crabgrass seed from growing. If adequate care is given to your soil, it will less likely be marred by crabgrass.
